Buddist: The Path to True Peace Matthew 11:28-30

"Come unto **ME**, all you that labour and are heavy laden,

and I will give you rest.

Take My yoke upon you, and learn of ME; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and you shall find rest for your souls. For MY yoke is easy, & MY burden is light."

We all know **something is wrong** with this world: "We all agree that life is full of suffering." / [explain later]

- But the Bible tells us why: it's not just part of a cycle
- we suffer because the world is broken by sin ⇒ What is sin?
- We live in a world filled with <u>suffering</u>, <u>anxiety</u>, <u>and spiritual thirst</u>.
- Many seek peace.
- Some look to <u>religion</u>, others to <u>silence</u>, and others to <u>discipline</u>.
- But even in those paths, peace often seems distant.
- Buddhism speaks deeply about suffering & the desire for liberation.
- But today, I want to present a message <u>not about effort</u>, but about <u>rest</u>.
- Not about a path to walk alone,
 but about a <u>Savior who came to carry you</u>.

Jesus Christ said, "Come unto ME... and I will give you rest."

- Today's message is not about a religion. ⇒ It's about a relationship
- A relationship with the One who is the source of eternal life.

Jesus Christ offers what no path of human effort can: true peace, forgiveness of sins, and eternal life — not earned, but given.

I. The Burden of Human Suffering (v.28)
"All you that labour & are heavy laden..."

"The Bible teaches that there is **one eternal, personal God who created all things**. He is holy, loving, and just.

He made us to know Him and live in peace."

- **A.** Jesus recognizes that <u>life is hard</u>, <u>burdensome</u>, <u>and full of pain</u>. He speaks to those "who labor"— those who *struggle under the weight of trying to do good*, *be good*, *and reach spiritual peace*.
- B. In Buddhism, suffering (dukkha) is central. It's real.
 And the Effort To End It Is Exhausting.
 But even after many cycles, the soul still longs for peace.

- Jesus sees this burden not just of suffering,
 but of trying to save yourself.
- He knows our hearts and calls us to Himself.

We all face specific burdens, struggles, and temptations and we all fail:

- The Bible uses several words to explain what is generally called "sin"
- According to the Word of God <u>sin includes all actions and attitudes</u>
 which "miss the mark" or "fall short" of God's holy character,
 including all "wrongdoing, ignorance, & affection on carnal desires.
- Sin is a willful expression of rebellion against the one true holy God.

"Sin is not just doing bad things—it's our heart turned away from God

- We try to live life on our own terms.
- This separates us from God and brings judgment."

Explaining Rom 6:23: For the payoff of sin is death, but the gift of God Wages of sin is death... is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GNT For sin pays its wage—death; but God's free gift (Good News Translation) is eternal life in union with Christ Jesus our Lord.

MSG (The Work hard for sin your whole life and your pension is death.

Message) But God's gift is <u>real life</u>, eternal life, delivered by Jesus, our Master*.

- Wages = what we earn (because of sin)
- Death = separation from God
- Gift = something given freely
- Eternal life = restored relationship with God
- In Christ Jesus = the only source of life
- C. "You don't need to carry this weight alone anymore."
 - You may be spiritually weary from trying to be better,

 □ reach nirvana, eliminate karma.

But the gospel says: Come, not climb. Receive, not earn.

"Jesus doesn't add to your burden. He takes it."

 Unlike the <u>endless cycle of rebirth in Buddhism</u>, the Gospel, the "Good News about Jesus Christ", offers a <u>once-for-all solution</u>:

He took our place, He was our substitute

Because we could not reach God ⇒ He came to us

Jesus, God's Son, lived a perfect life & died for our sins* on the cross↑

- ⇒ He rose from the dead ⇒ to offer forgiveness and eternal life
 - "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Rom 5:8

Buddhists believe in **karma** — cause and effect.

- ⇒ Christianity offers something radically different: GRACE↓
 - a GIFT from God that we do not deserve and cannot earn
- In Buddhism, your future ⇒ depends on your past actions.
- In the Gospel, your future depends on what Jesus has done for you.
- You don't have to earn it—it's a gift you receive by faith."

For **by grace** you have been saved* **through faith**, and that not of yourselves; <u>it is the **gift** of God</u>, not as the result of "works", so that no one can boast. — Eph 2:8-9

II. The Gift of a New Savior and Lord / Master "Take MY yoke upon you, and LEARN OF ME..." (v.29)

- A. Jesus offers a "yoke" a symbol of submission, but also of <u>partnership</u>. He says: <u>Let ME lead</u>. ● <u>Let ME walk with you</u>
- B. In religion, yokes are often heavy.
- Laws, rules, and obligations an endless path of self-effort.
- Jesus offers a different kind of yoke: <u>light, relational, & full of grace*</u>
- This is not mere knowledge, but personal discipleship. "Learn of Me"
 - Jesus is <u>a teacher</u>, but also THE SAVIOR who walks with you.

"Stop striving. Start walking with the Savior."

In Buddhism, there is no divine helper — only self.

But Jesus says: I am with you,

I will walk with you, and I will carry your burden.

"You don't need a system.

→ You need a Savior."

III. The Promise of Rest for Your Soul

"You shall find REST unto your souls." (v.29)

- A. Jesus doesn't just give physical rest or emotional peace
 - He promises rest for the soul.
 - That deep, eternal peace that ends our spiritual wandering.
- B. In Christianity, REST means RECONCILIATION with God.
- Not annihilation of self,
 - ⇒ but restoration of the soul through forgiveness.

Col 1:20 — "Having made peace through the blood of his cross..."

- The gospel is that **Jesus died for your sins**.
- He didn't teach a way out of suffering
- He entered into suffering to save you from it.
- **C.** "He doesn't just guide you to peace He is your peace."
- You do not have to wait for another life.
- You do not have to undo your karma.
- You can have forgiveness and eternal life today.

"The peace you seek is a Person: Jesus Christ."

- Jesus didn't come to show you <u>another path</u> to follow.
 - He came to be the Way. Jn 14:6
- ✓ He lived the perfect life you could not live.
- He died the death you deserved.
- ✓ He rose again to give you eternal life
 - not after many lives, but now.

Conclusion If you've tried to find peace and failed, if you've followed paths & still feel empty — Jesus is calling

"Come unto Me... and I will give you rest."

He doesn't offer religion. ⇒ **He offers** *Himself***.**

You don't need to be born many times to find truth.

You need to be born again (John 3:3)

This new life comes by faith.

Imagine a person trapped in a burning house.

Buddhism offers advice:
 'Try to meditate your way out, remain calm, detach from fear.'

Jesus, however, rushes into the fire, carries you out,
 ⇒ and takes the burns for you. ⇒ That's the Gospel.

Appeal Do you want this peace? Do you want to know this Savior?

You can pray now:

"Lord Jesus, I admit I am tired and lost.

I cannot save myself.

I believe You died for me and rose again.

I TURN from my sin and TRUST IN YOU ALONE.

Be my peace.

Be my Lord. Amen."
